

Academic Literature: G7-G8

Course Description

In this literature and writing course, students will gain the fundamentals of reading and writing with a literary focus through a wide array of novels, short stories, and poetry on the theme of **loyalty** and **friendship**. The class will dive into the key literary and stylistic devices necessary for higher-level analysis of literature and texts and students will apply their knowledge and understanding through academic writing, preparing them for the future rigors of high-school classes and AP/IB exams.

Overview

Each class will cover the following elements:

Vocabulary

Grammar and/or **Literary Concept** (sentence types, subject-verb agreement; figurative language, conflict) In-class **Writing** related to material, theme, quotes, characterization, etc

Discussion and **Analysis** of homework and in-class writing, reading content
